Columbus Career and College Academy (CCCA) is a unique high school in Columbus County and in North Carolina. Students have the opportunity to complete tuition-free courses that will lead to college degrees and certifications while earning their North Carolina high school diploma.

CCCA students are held to high academic and moral standards. Students are expected to take responsibility for their learning and be willing to do what it takes to succeed.

In addition to completing the Early College requirements, students will select and complete a pathway from the following: Culinary Arts, Communications & Broadcasting, Metal Machining, or Masonry Construction.

- The Broadcasting and Communications program instills a variety of skills for students to use in their future careers. CCCA students in this program also broadcast many school functions around the county. Students also learn many technical programs such as Adobe software while having the opportunity to become certified in their pathway.
- Culinary arts entails the intensive study of cookery, baking, entrepreneurial endeavors, and food safety via the ServSafe course. The culinary program emphasizes the commercial application of skills, which can lead to a career in a wide array of foodservice careers spanning from restaurant owner or executive chef, to food critic or food stylist. Successful completion of the program will result in a culinary certification.
- Courses in the metal machining pathway include Drafting I and II, Metals Manufacturing I and II. Machinists, welders, and tool and die makers are employed in virtually every area of manufacturing including heavy or large machinery, aerospace, automobiles, shipbuilding, and parts manufacturing.
- The Masonry program includes four high school masonry courses. Students coming out of the masonry program may seek jobs with local masonry or carpentry professionals
- At CCCA, all students have the opportunity to earn a two year Associate Degree in the various areas offered by SCC.

In recent years, Columbus Career and College Academy has earned the following honors:

- Culinary students have received numerous awards in local, state, and national competitions.
